just a few words. Times like these aren't made
for long speeches.

Our old people have been sent to Poland the 14th
of February. To-day I received enclosed card
with their new address. They have gone there
with the second transport that's been sent from
Vienna because of lack of a chance to emigrate.
As sad and unthinkable painful it is it must
be said that what's happened couldn't be helped.
Maybe money could have spared them from this
deportation but why talk about things that just
can't be -

Anyway they ^{are in} need there and depend upon the
support of their Viennese friends as they write.
Well, I shall do my share and I expect the
same from you. I try here everything possible. Now
that I know their address I am going to send
them affidavits: one from myself and one or
two more. How far I shall get to raise the
money for the passage I don't know.

Your letter reached me about two weeks ago.
This is my second letter to you since then.

My person is put in the background in face of
these happenings.
